#### SUMMARY

- Main Campus enrollment stands at 15,416, a decrease of 436 students from the Fall 2002 semester
- The 2,772 African American students enrolled represent 18% of the total main campus enrollment
- Enrollment of First-Time Freshmen decreased by 71 students, from 1,759 Fall 2002 to 1,688 Fall 2003
- Average ACT score for First-Time Freshmen is 23.5
- 1,688 New First-Time Freshmen, including 22 National Merit Scholars

- The enrollment in Veterinary Medicine (DVM) is 220
- Undeclared enrollment undergraduate (UND) is 1,184 while graduate (UNC) is 217
