#### SUMMARY

- Main Campus enrollment stands at 15,117, a decrease of 299 students from the Fall 2003 semester
- The 2,778 African American students enrolled represent 18.4% of the total main campus enrollment
- Enrollment of First-Time Freshmen increased by 65 students, from 1,688 Fall 2003 to 1,753 Fall 2004
- Average ACT score for First-Time Freshmen is 23.3
- 1,753 New First-Time Freshmen, including 33 National Merit Scholars
