#### SUMMARY

- Main Campus enrollment stands at 14,395, this number excludes those students who are enrolled exclusively on-line
- The 2,843 African American students enrolled represent 19.8% of the total main campus enrollment
- Enrollment of First-Time Freshmen increased by 213 students, from 1,753 Fall 2004 to 1,966 Fall 2005
- Average ACT score for First-Time Freshmen is 23.2
- 1,966 New First-Time Freshmen, including 34 National Merit Scholars and 6 National Achievement

- Undeclared undergraduate enrollment (UND) is 1,067 while unclassified graduate enrollment (UNC) is 152
