Student Credit Hours 1994-2003



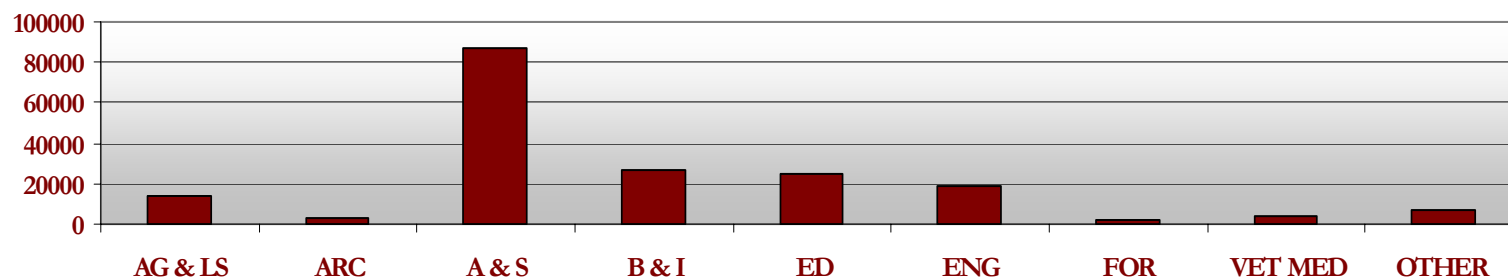

Student Credit Hours Fall 2003



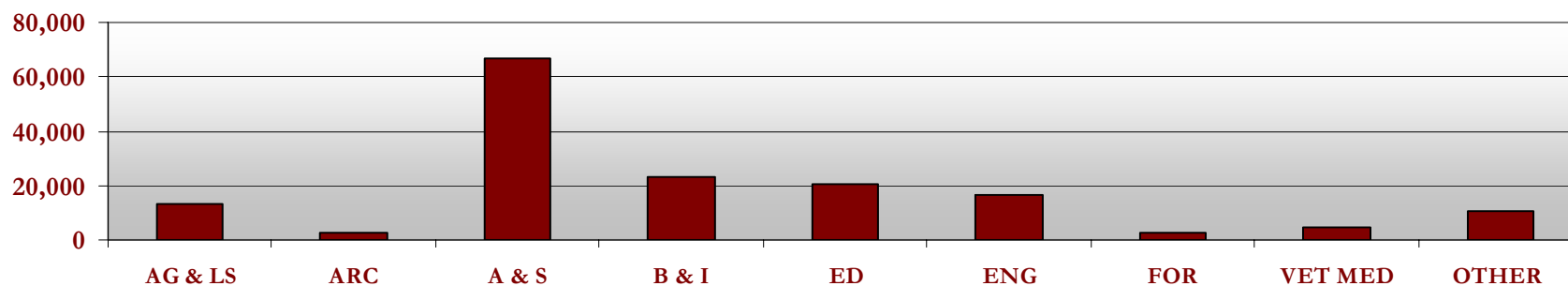

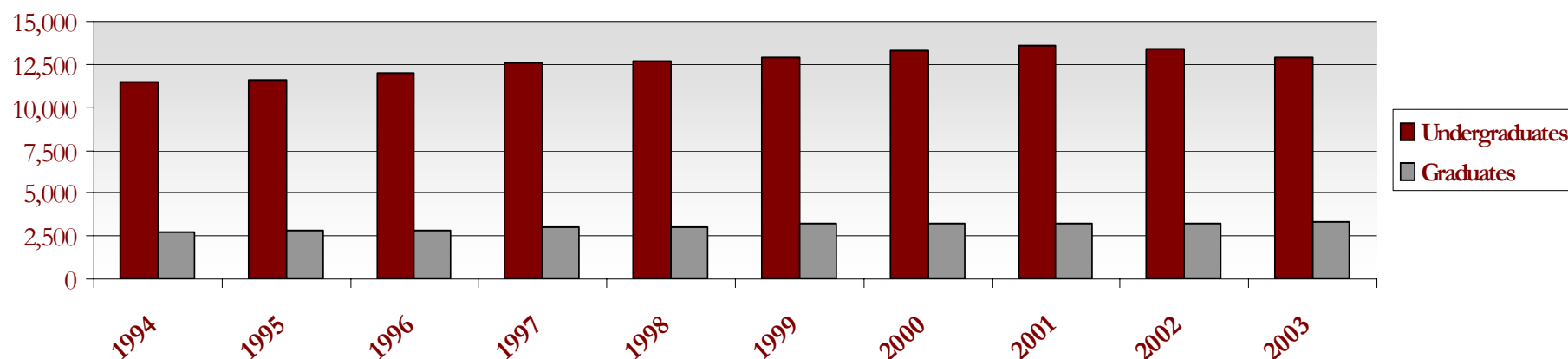

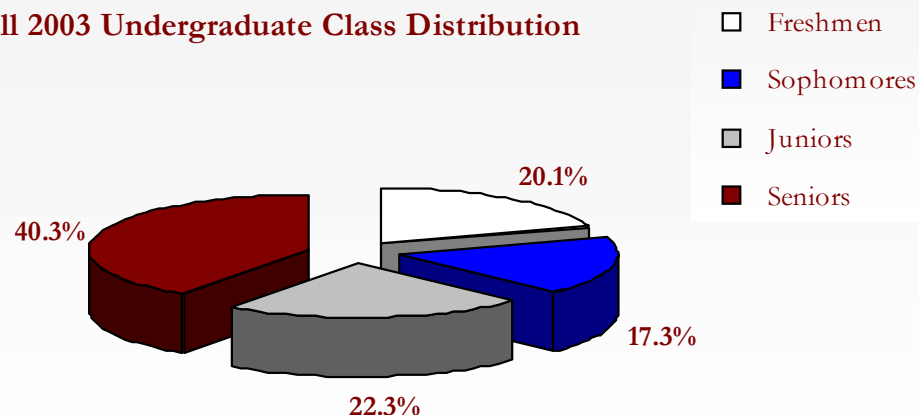

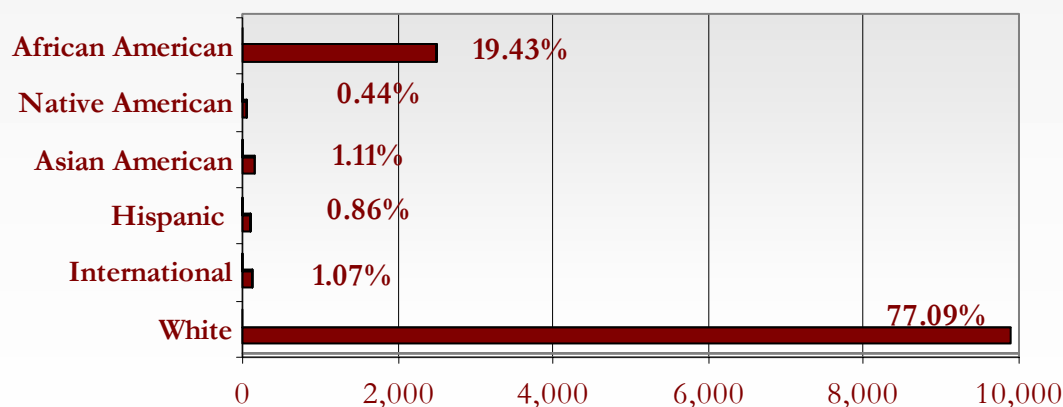

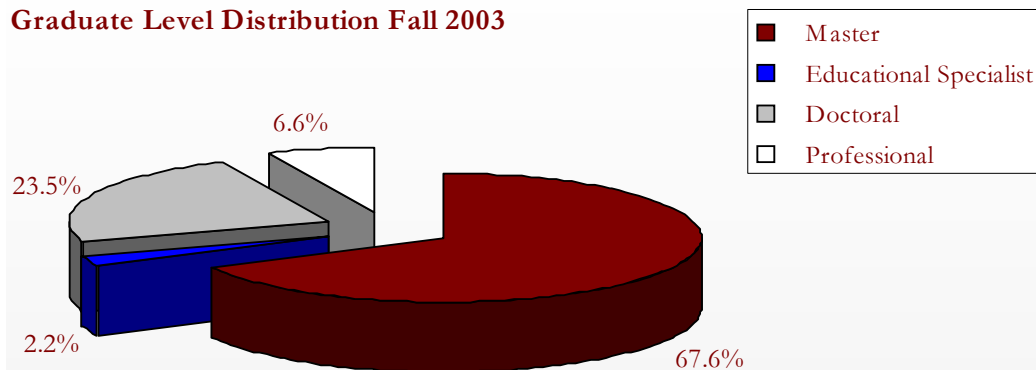

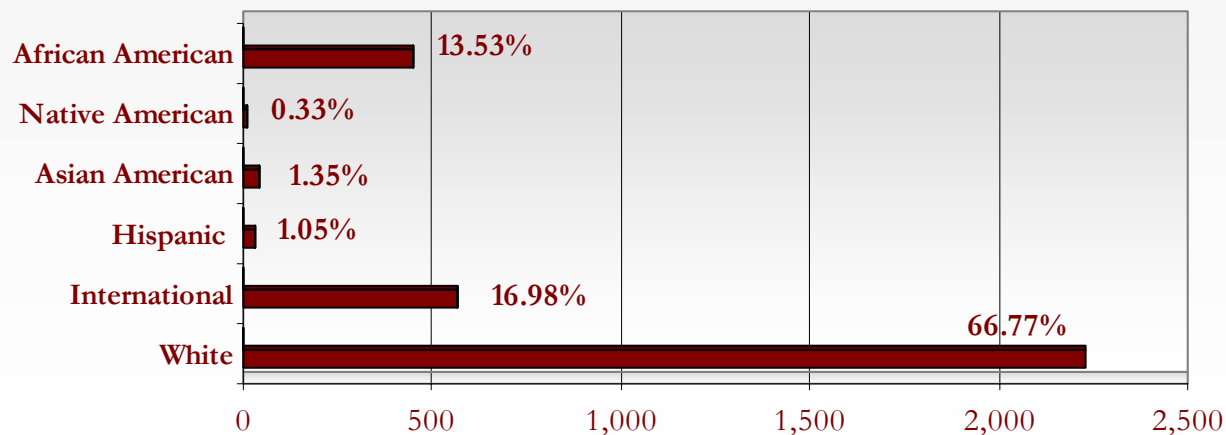

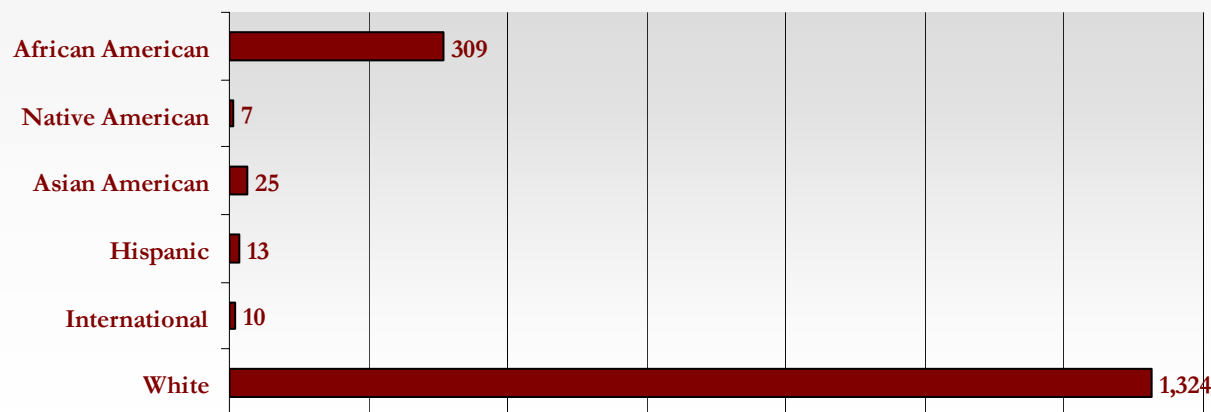

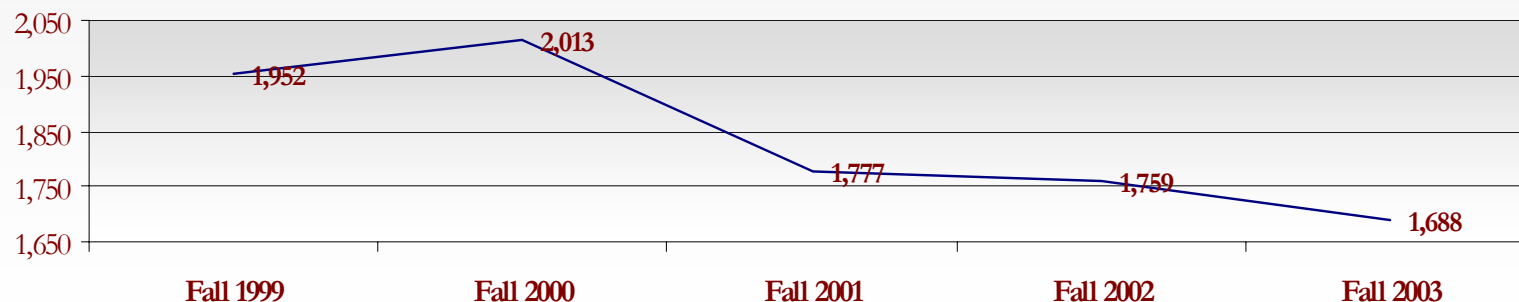

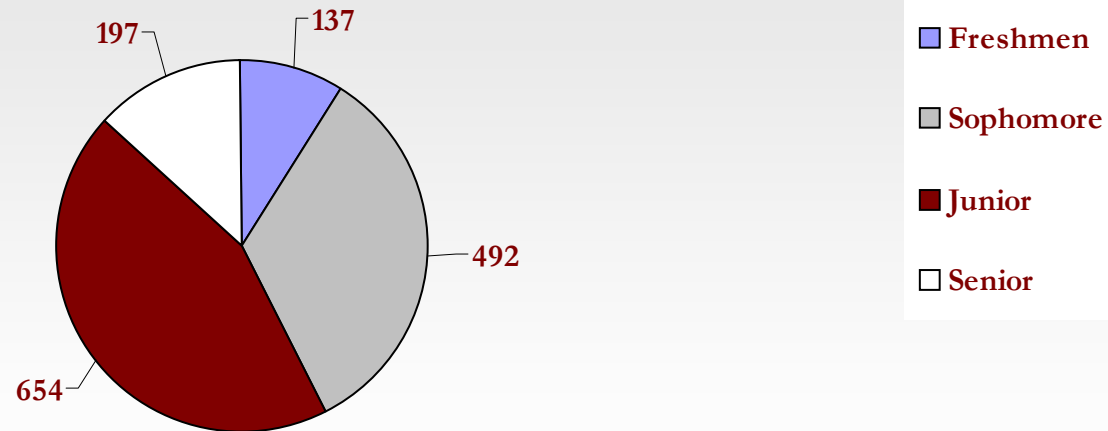

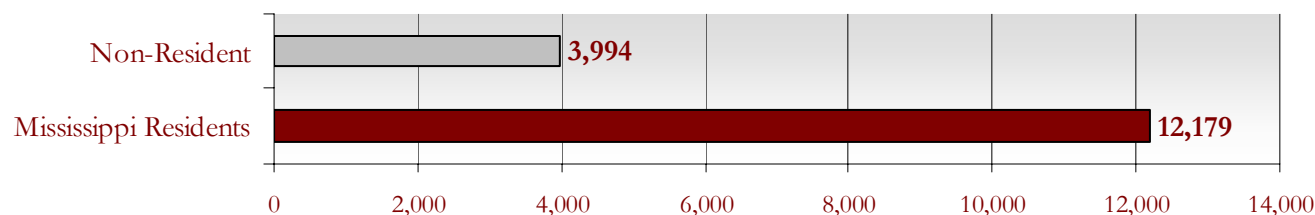

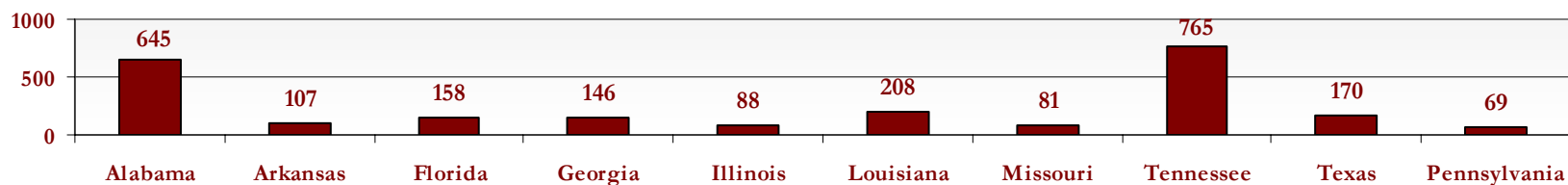

Out of State Students Top Ten Home States Fall 2003



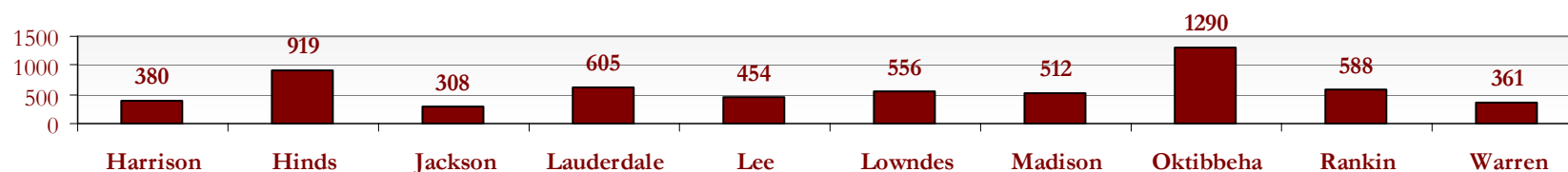
