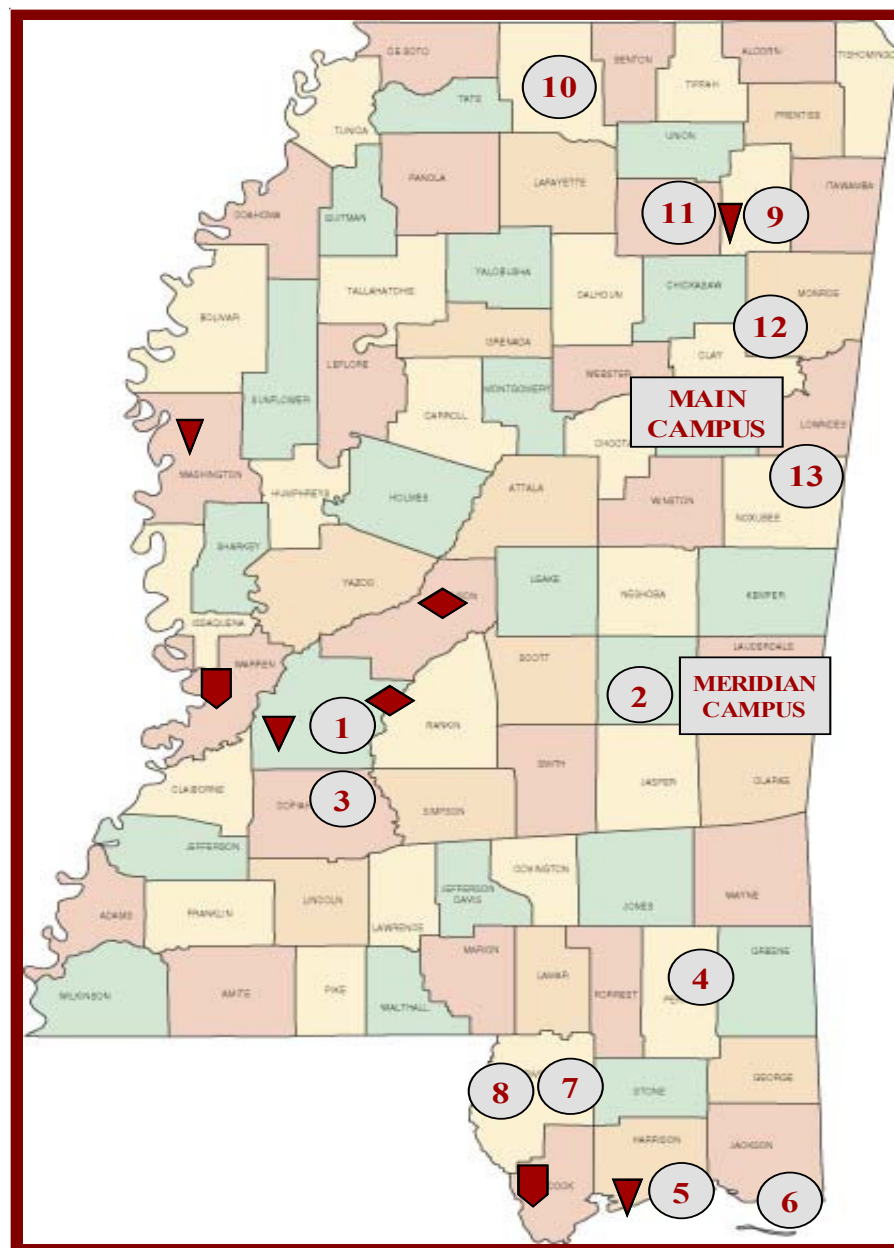

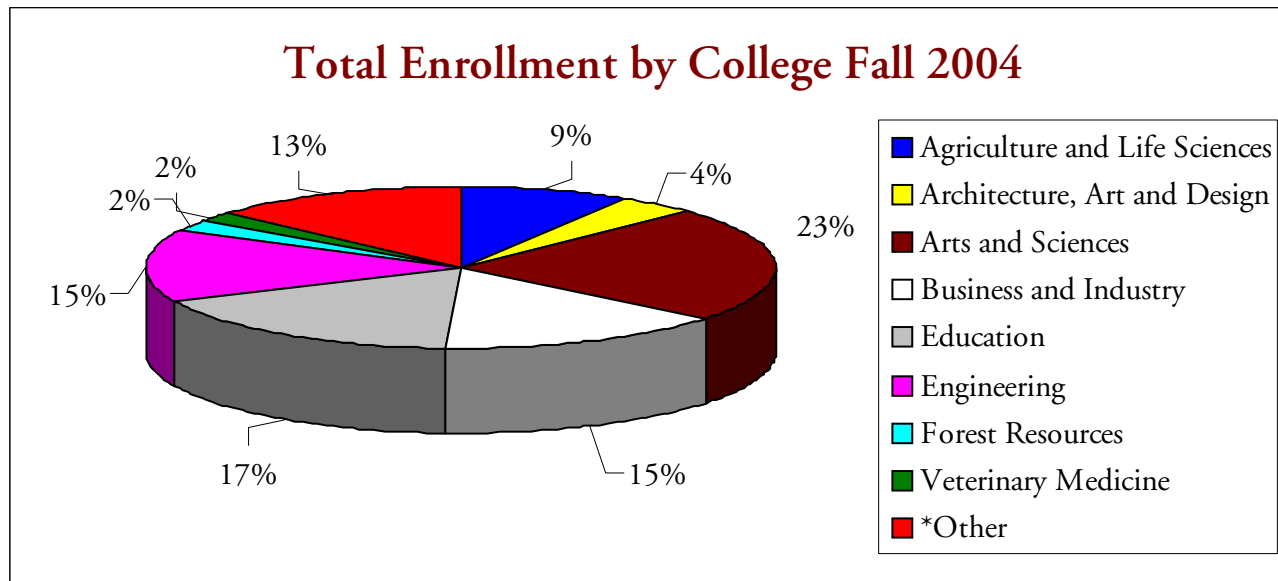

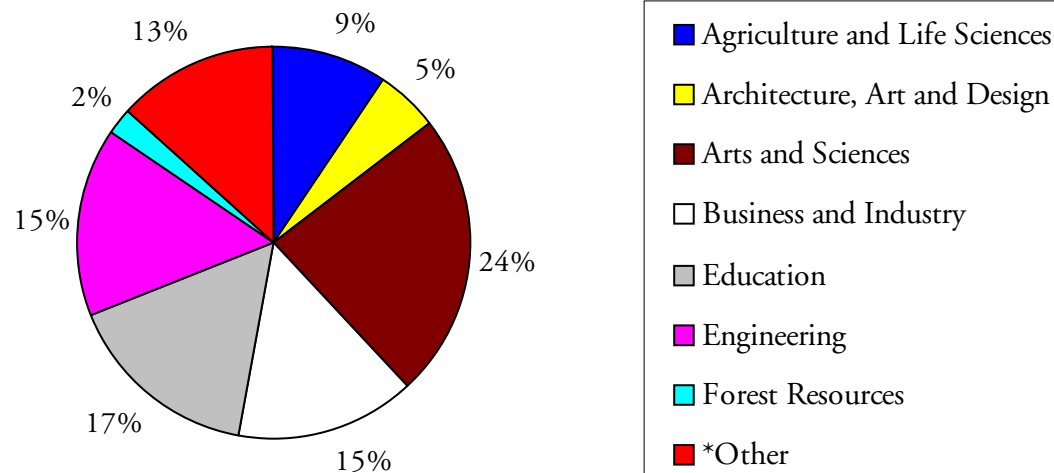

Undergraduate Enrollment by College Fall 2004



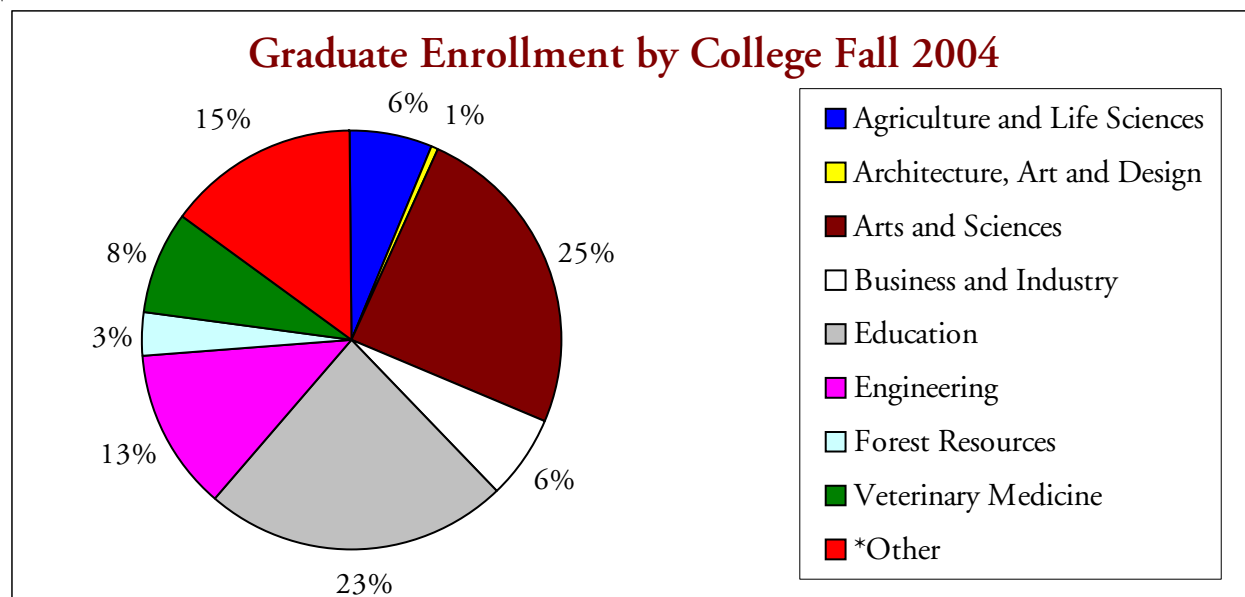

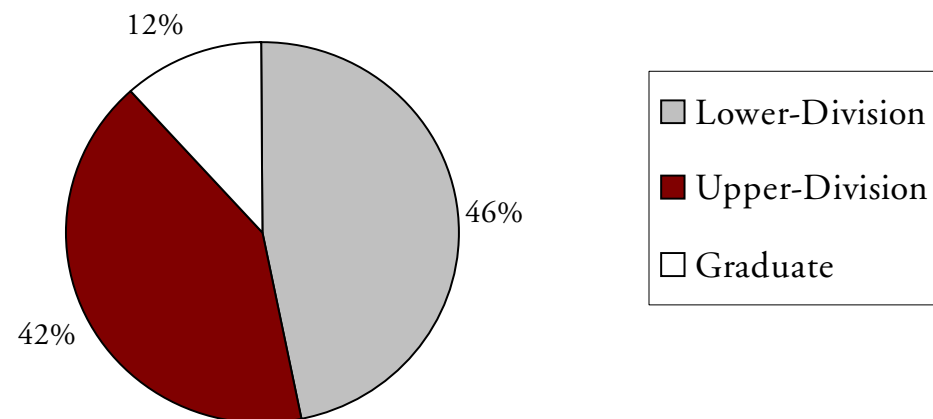

ORGANIZATION CHARTS

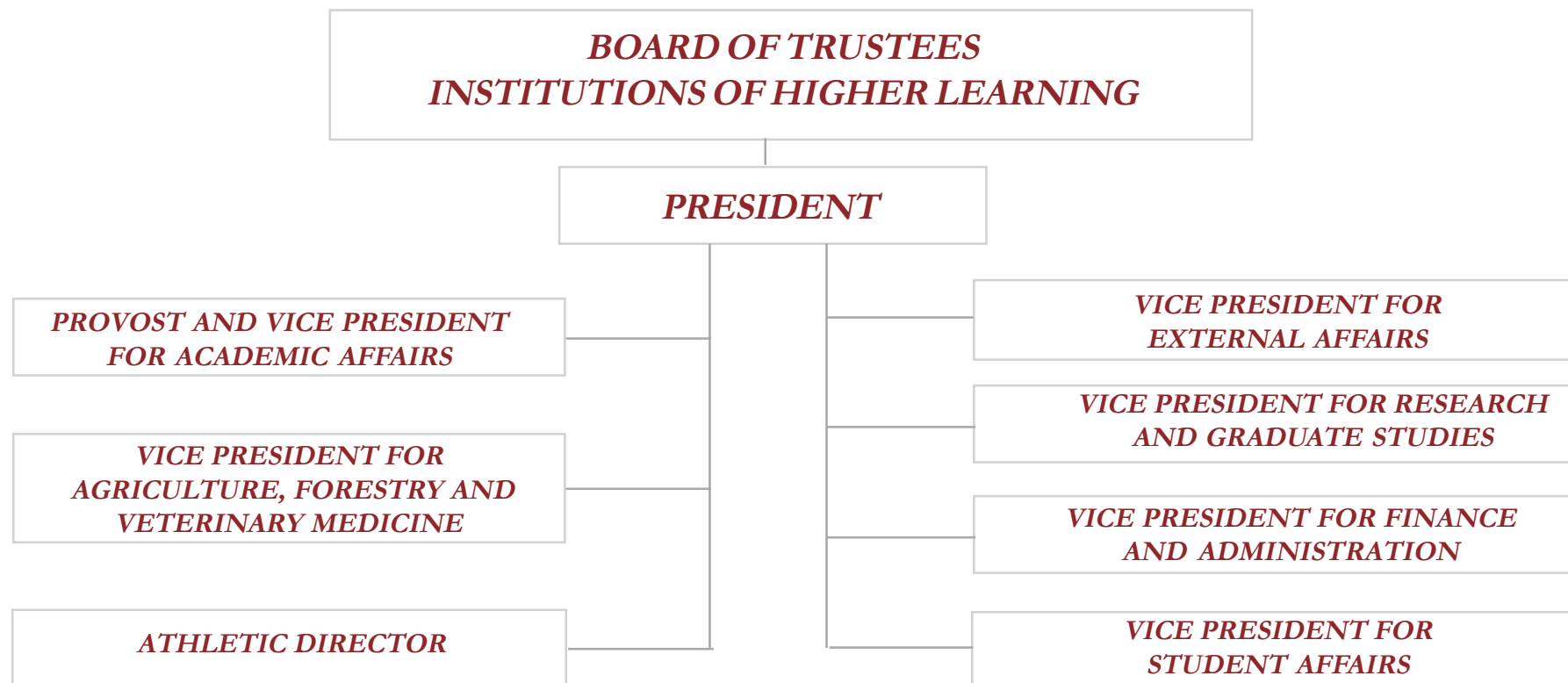

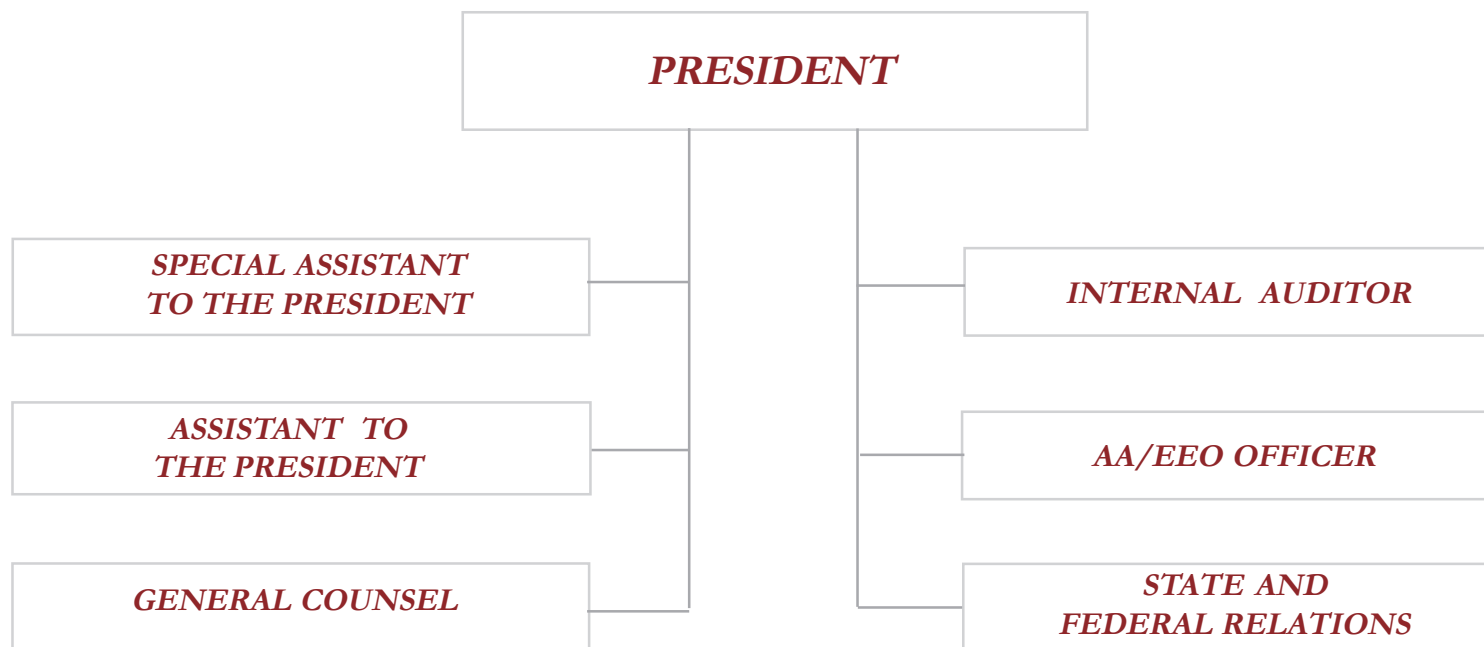


UNIVERSITY ORGANIZATION



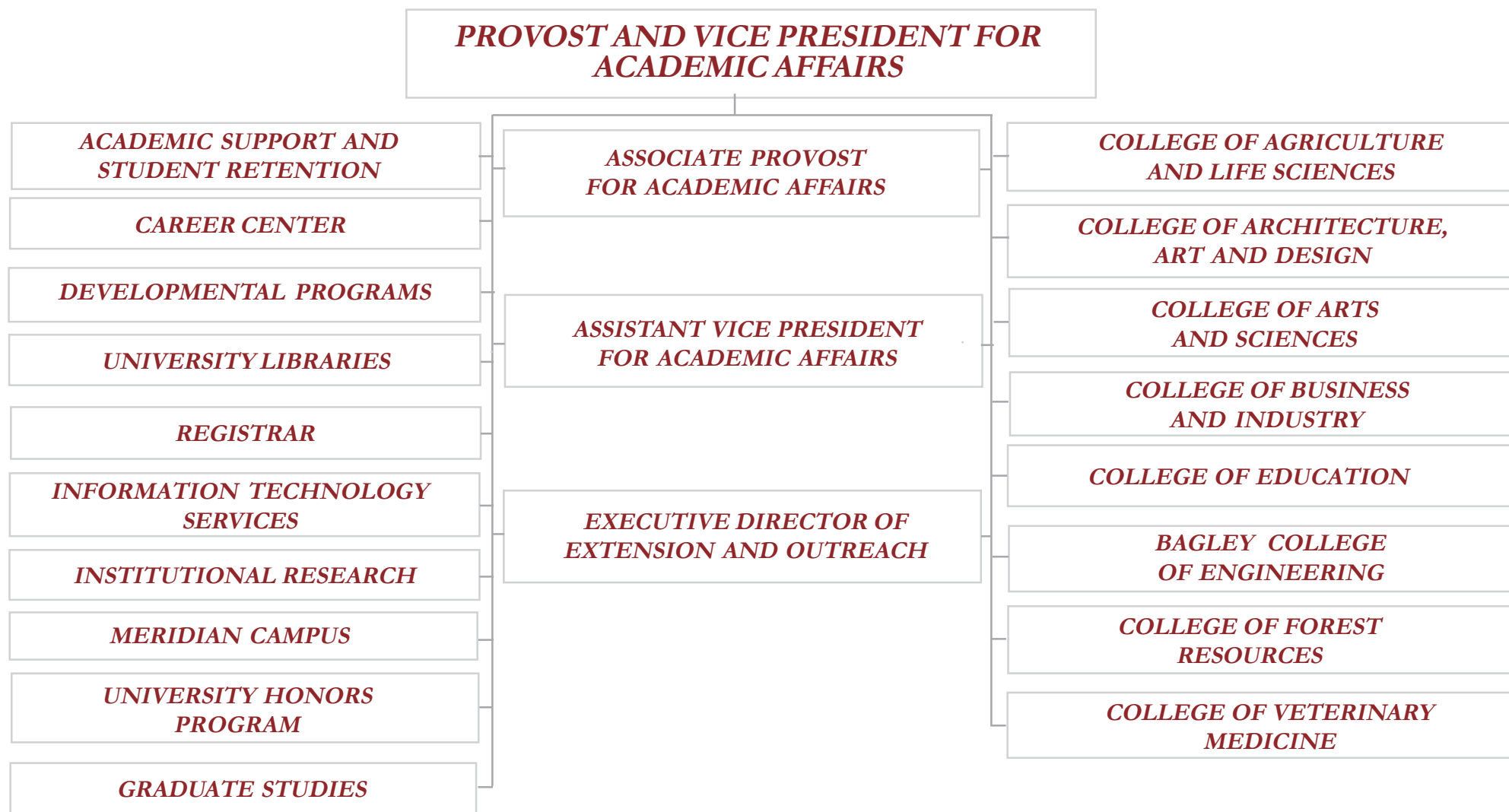

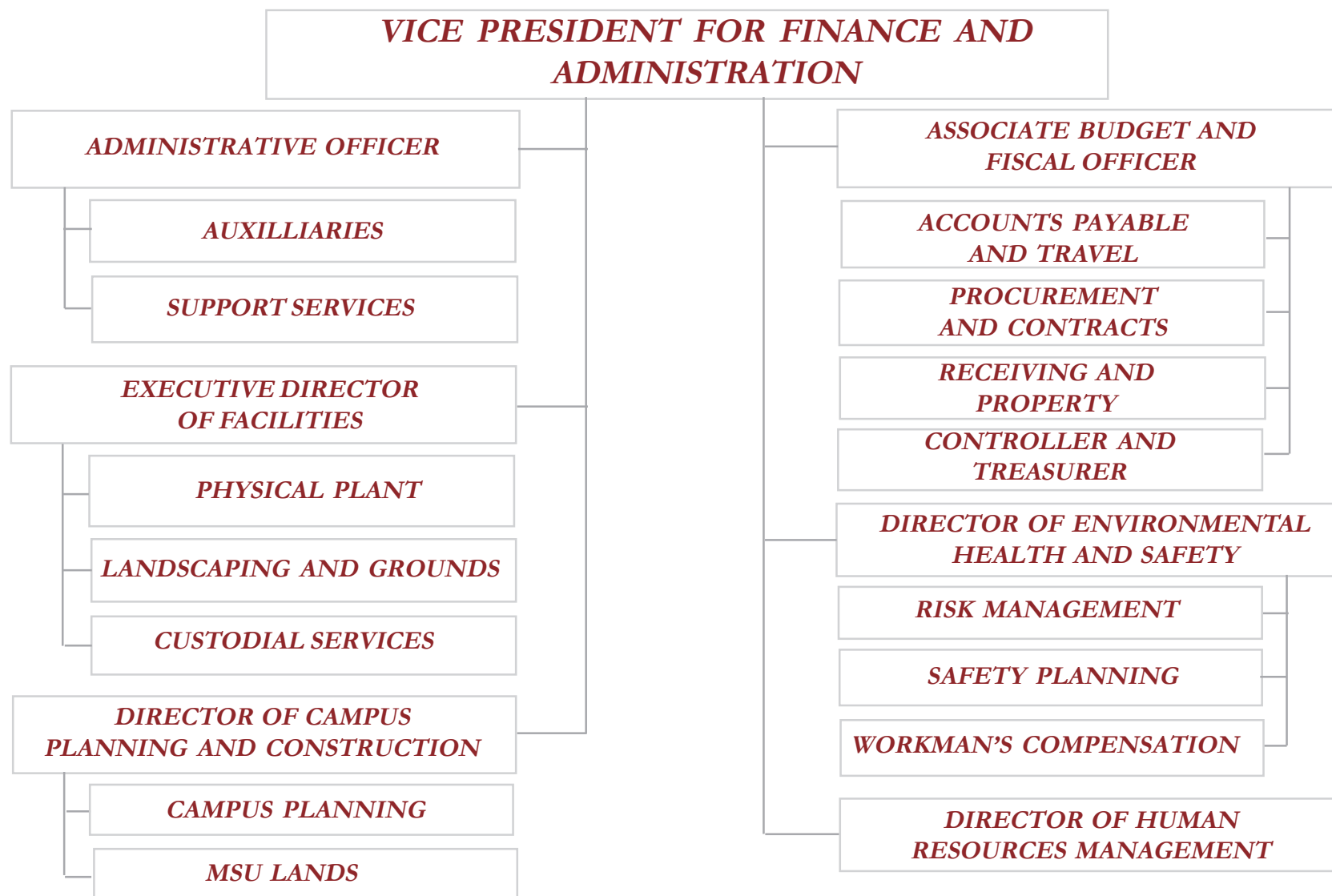


DIVISION OF ACADEMIC AFFAIRS



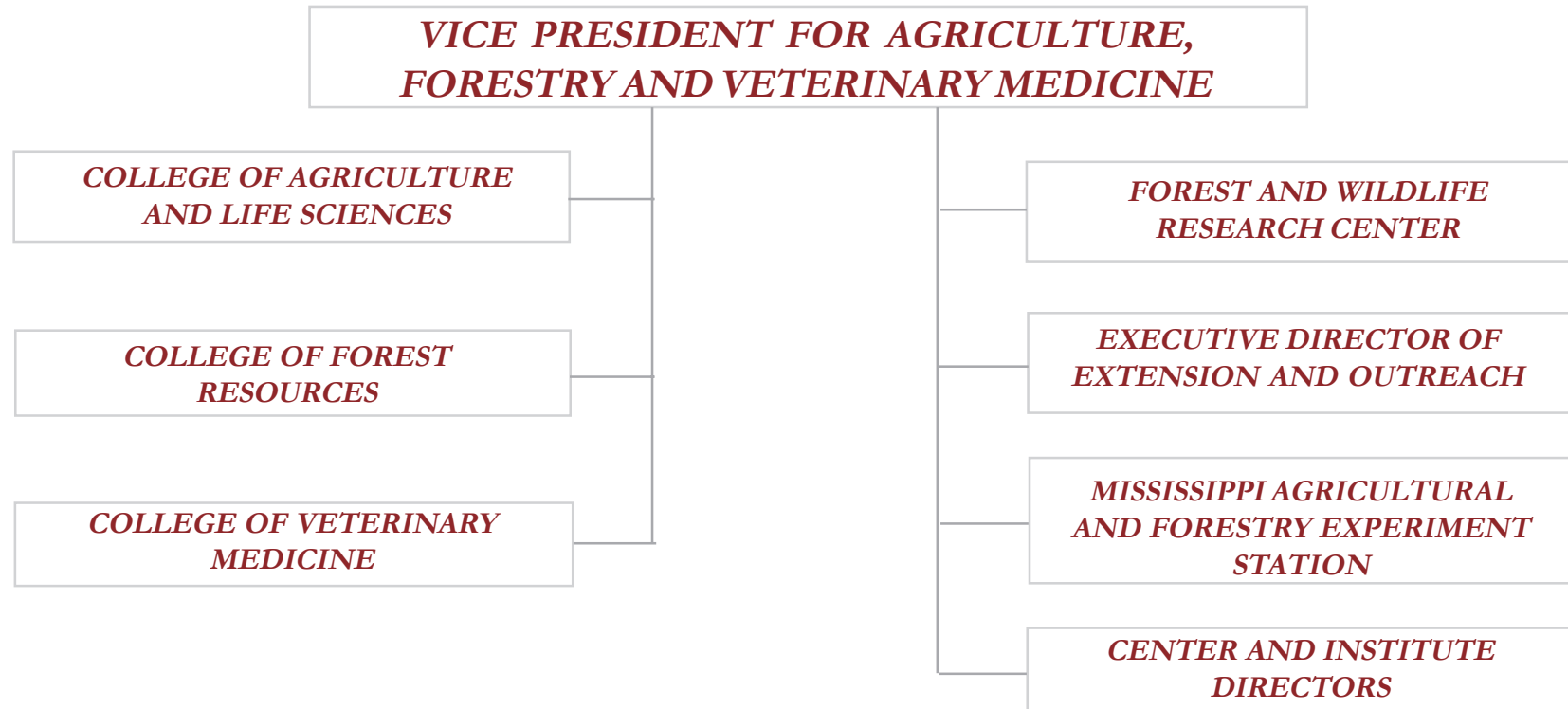


DIVISION OF FINANCIAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE AFFAIRS



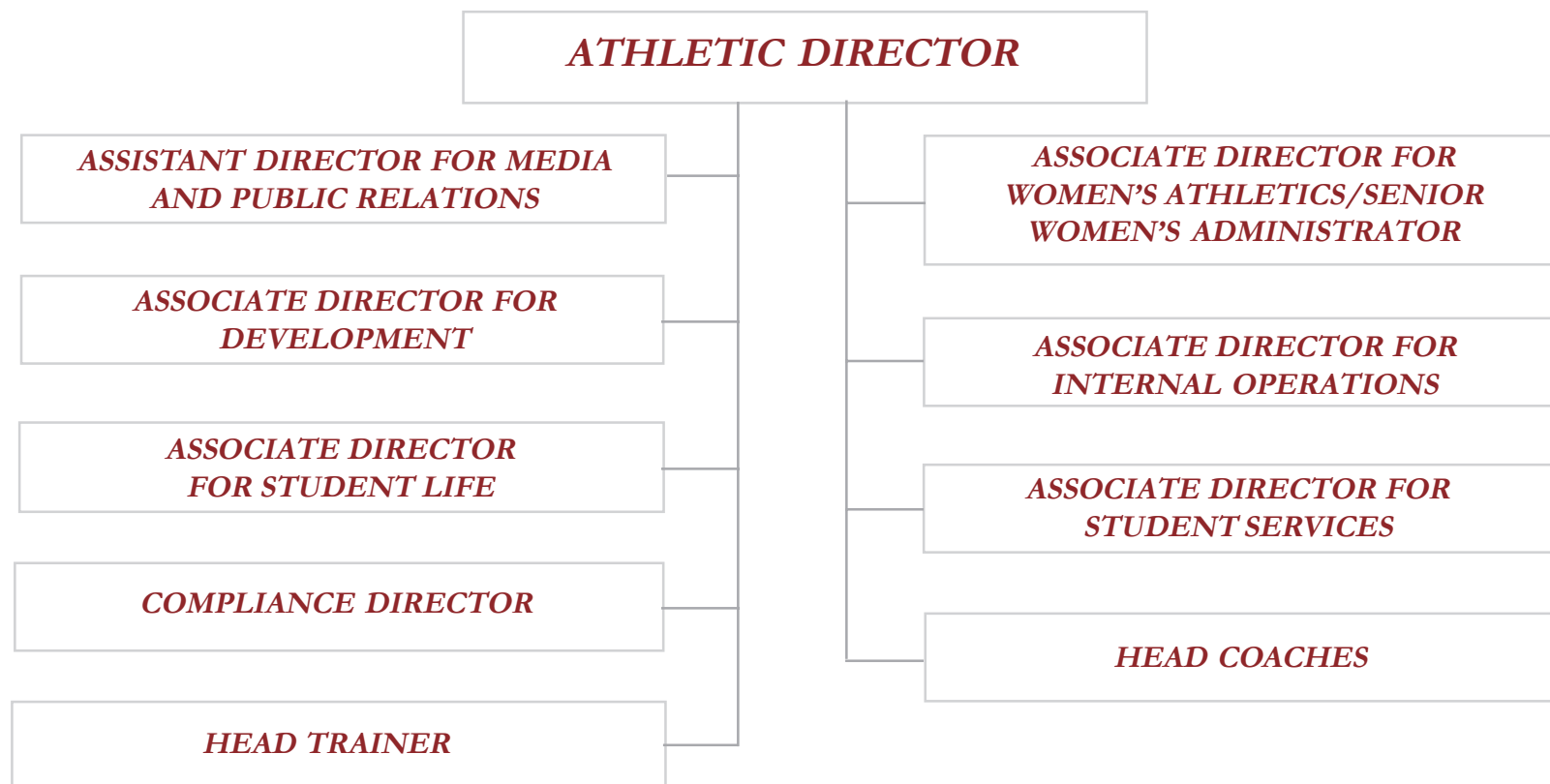


DIVISION OF AGRICULTURE, FORESTRY AND VETERINARY MEDICINE

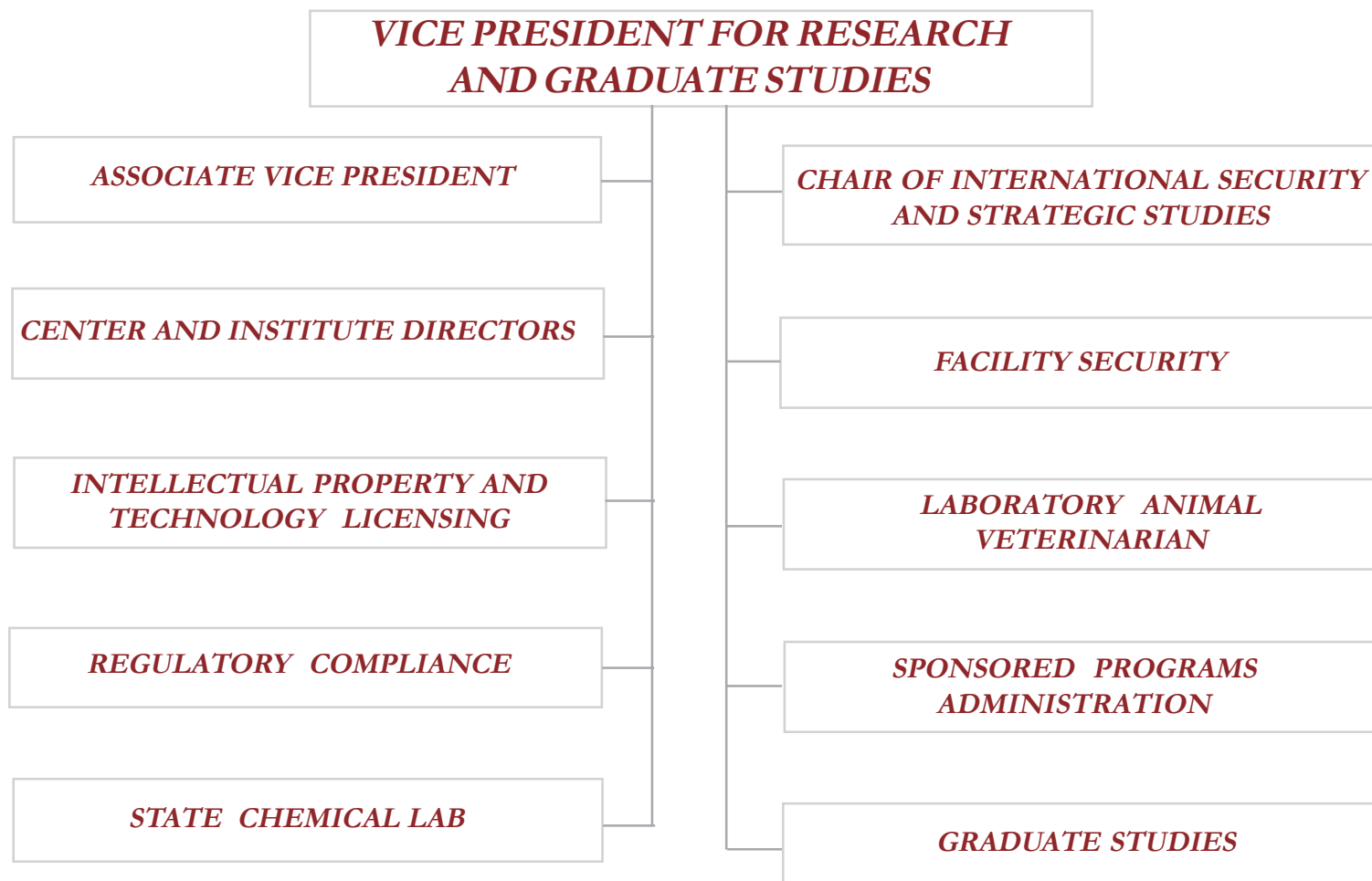

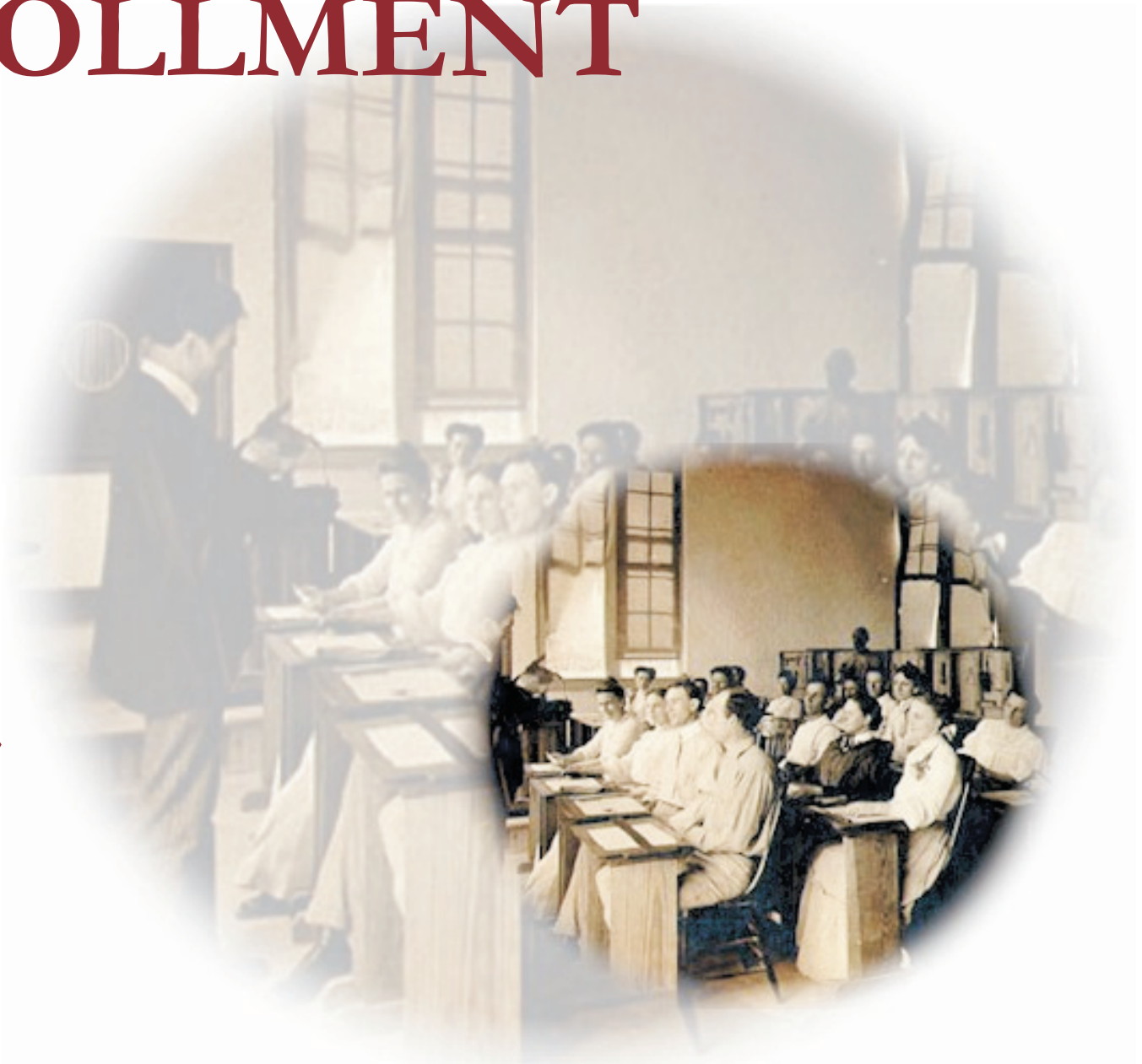

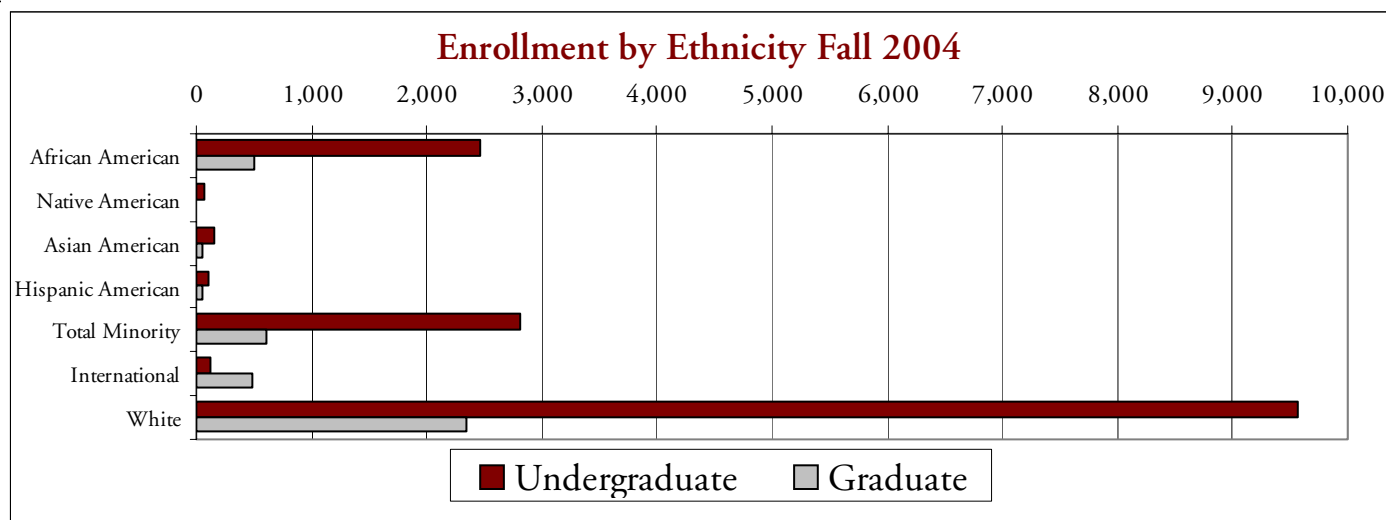

Student Credit Hours Fall 2004



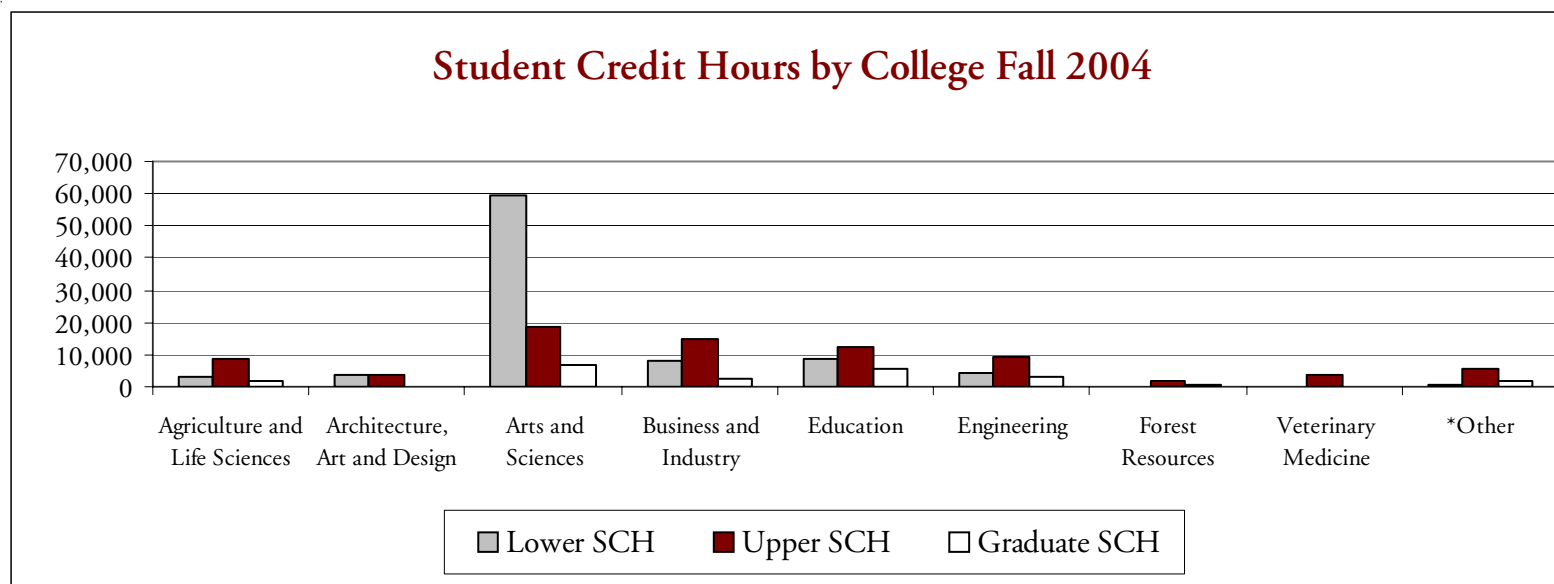

STUDENT CREDIT HOURS FALL 2004



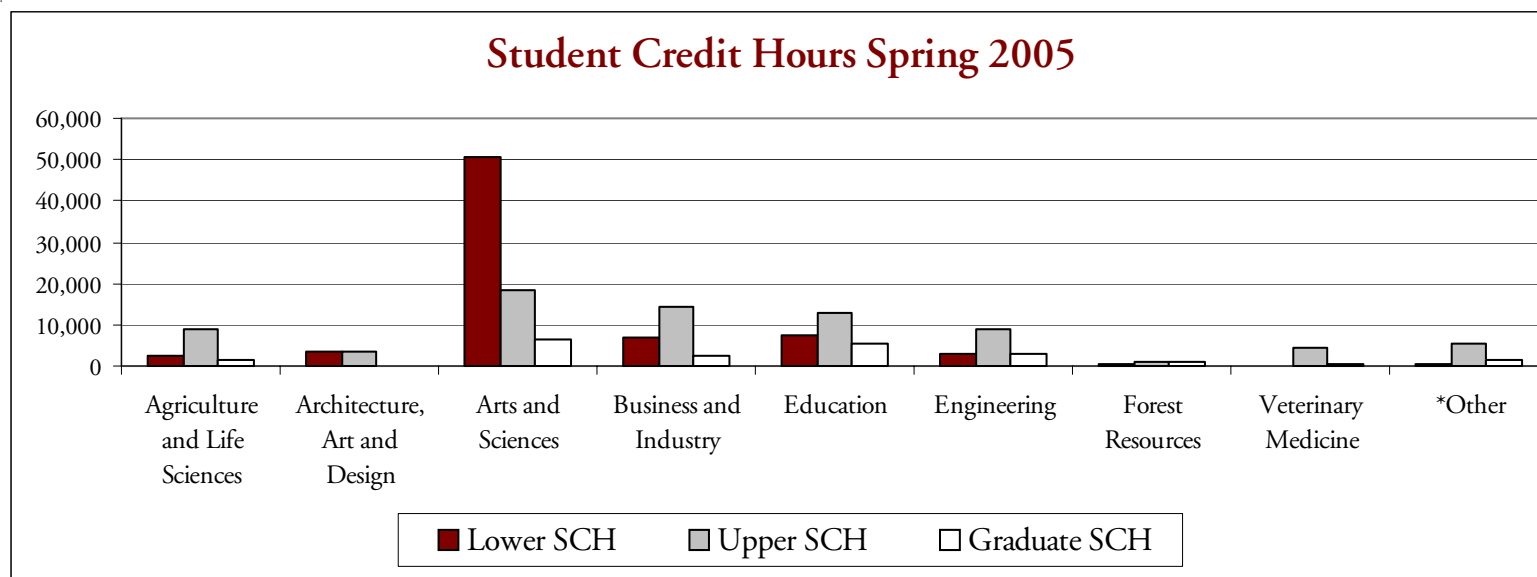

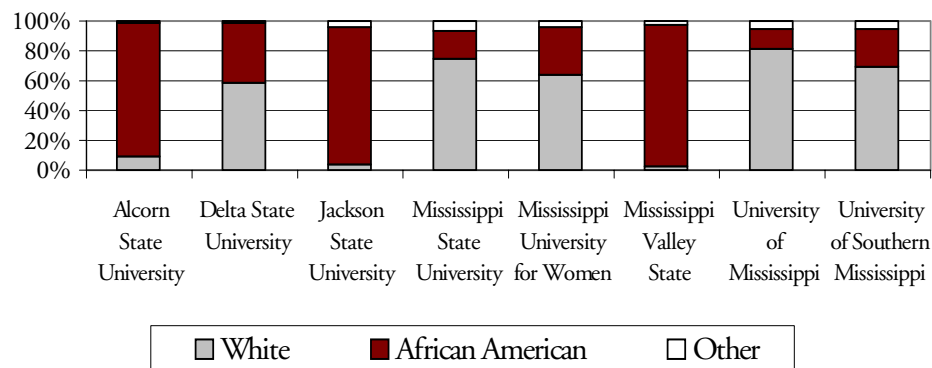

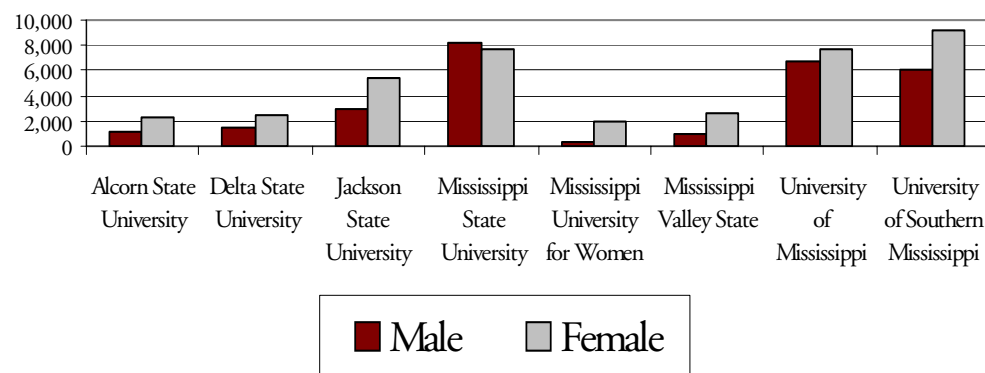

IHL Enrollment by Gender Fall 2004

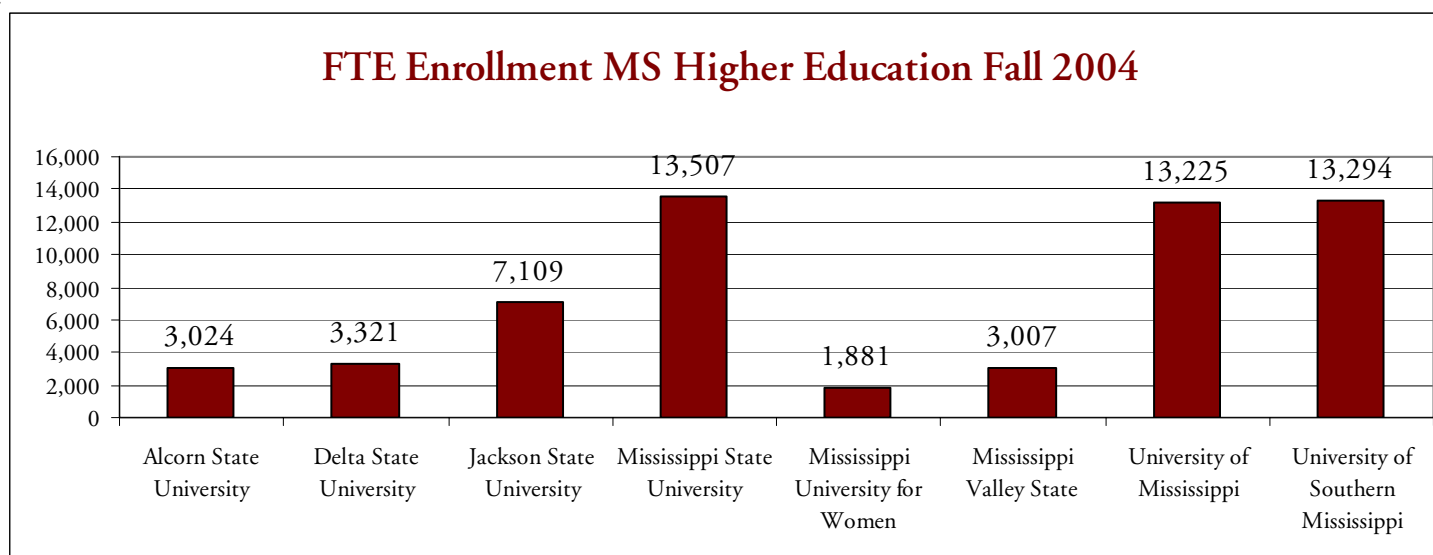

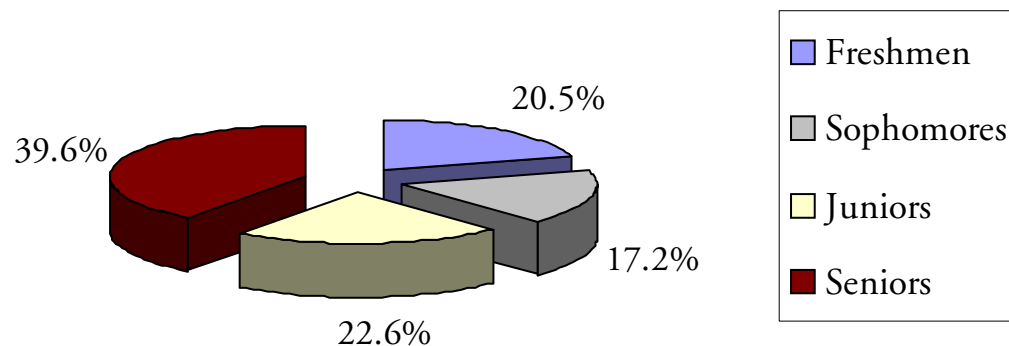

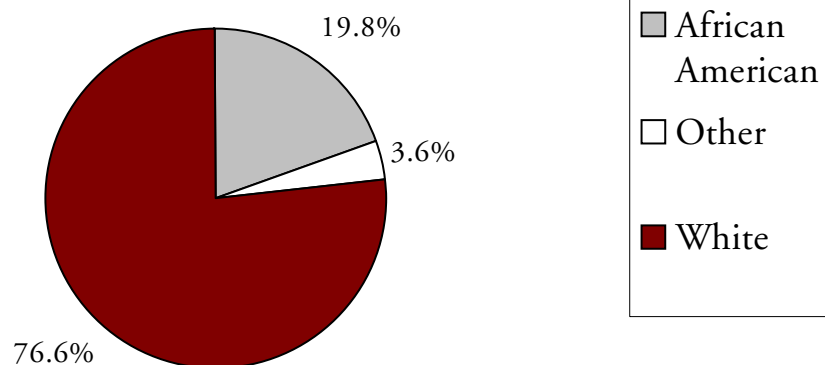

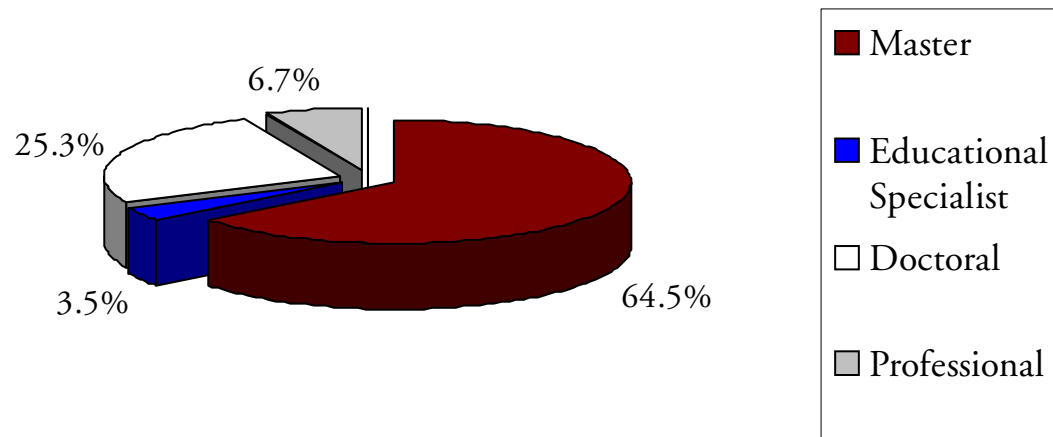

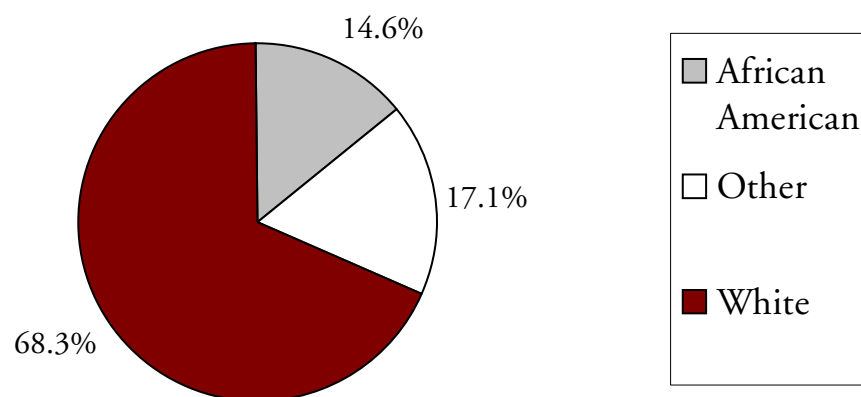

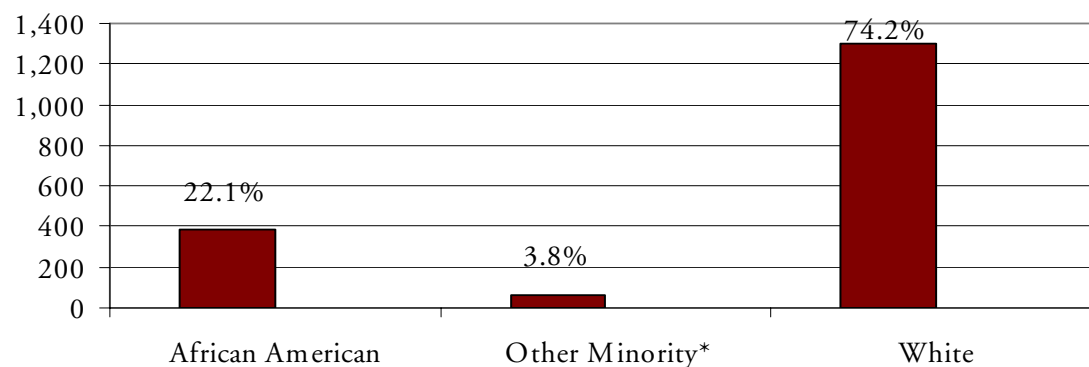

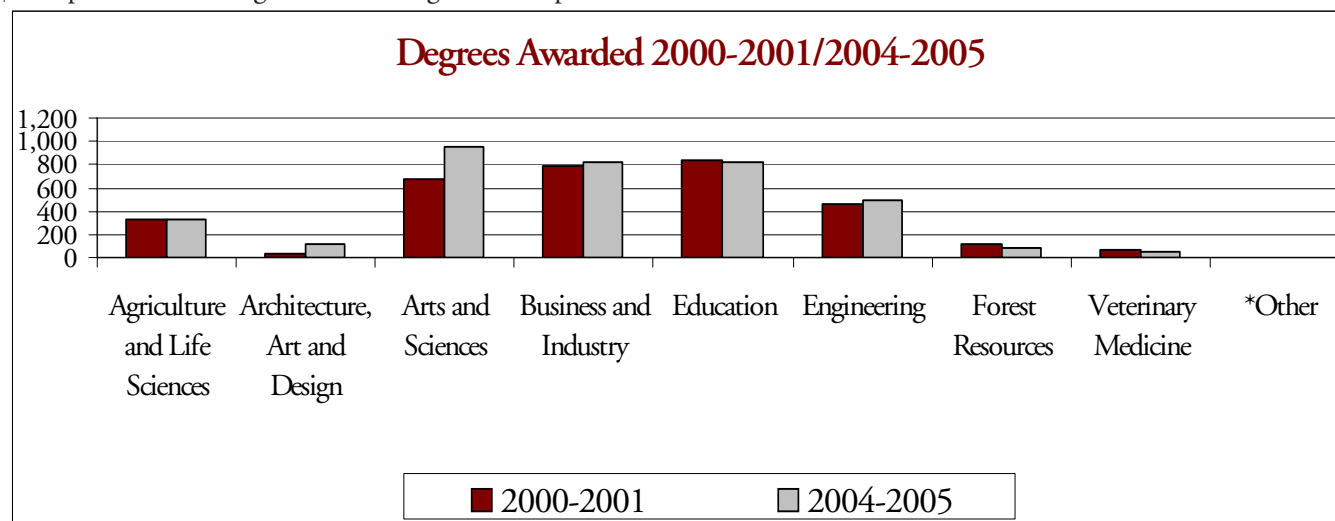

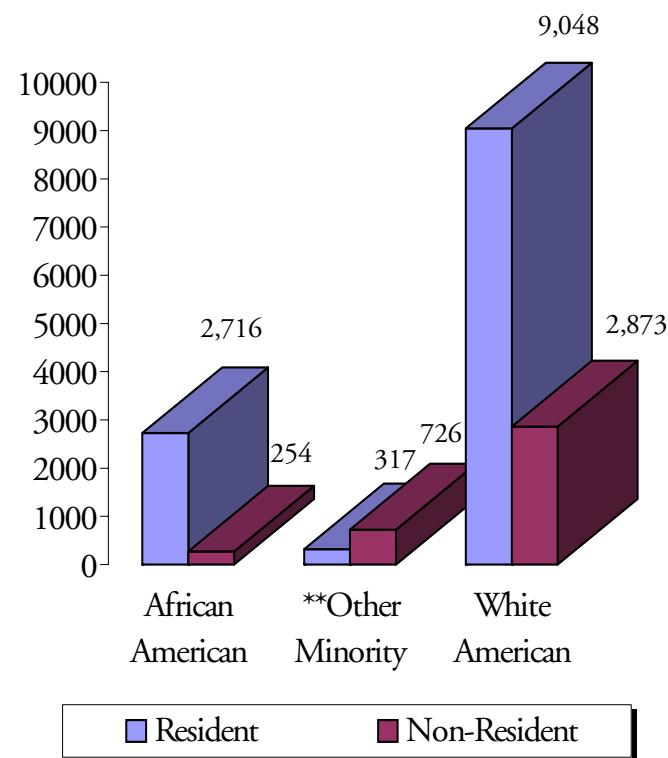

MS Residents Top Ten Home Counties Fall 2004



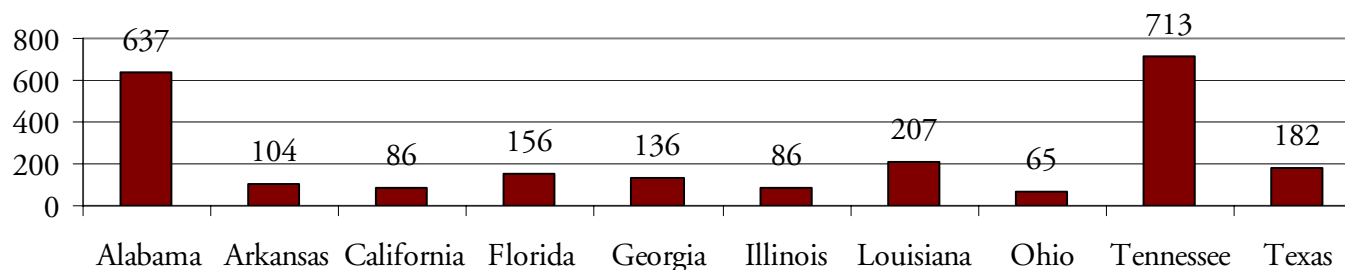

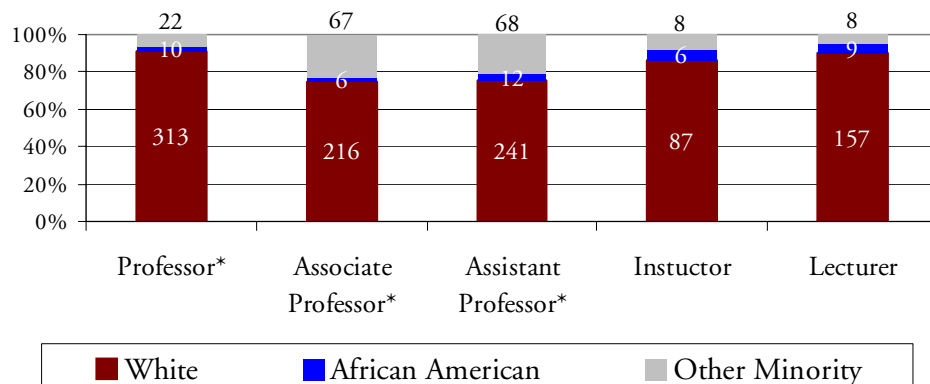

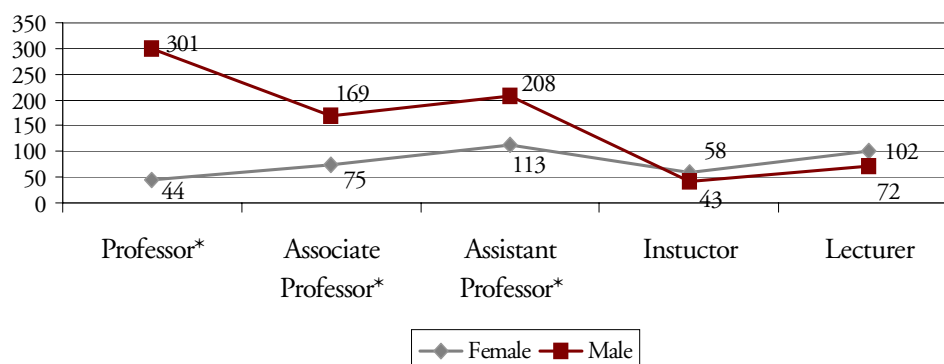

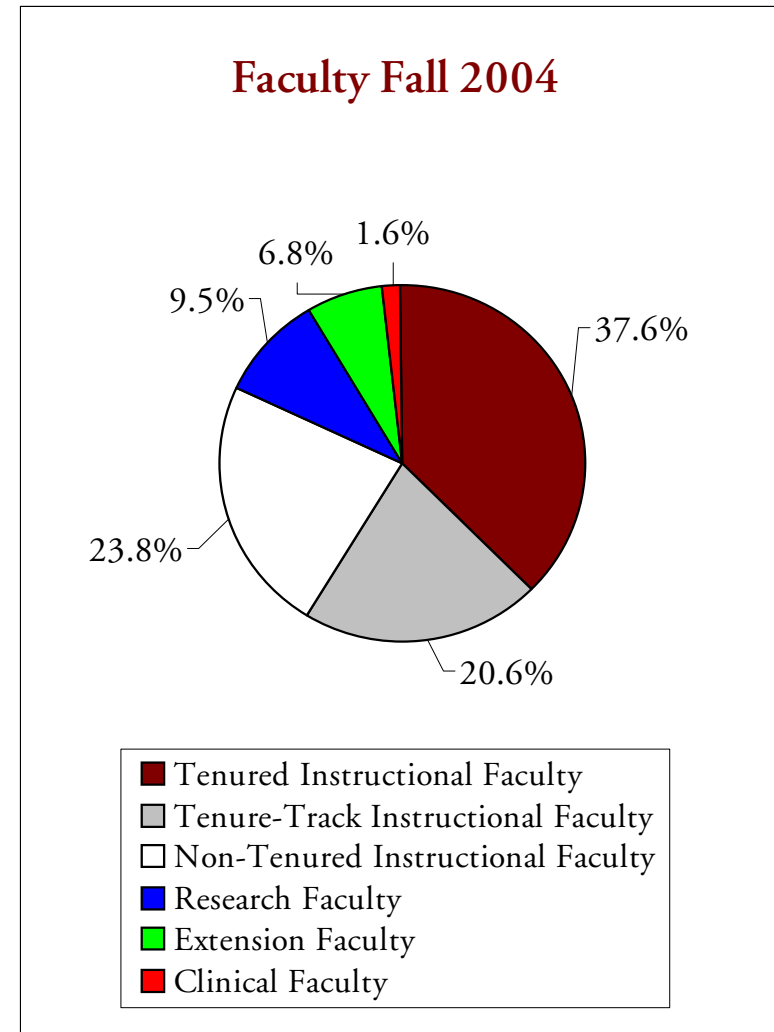

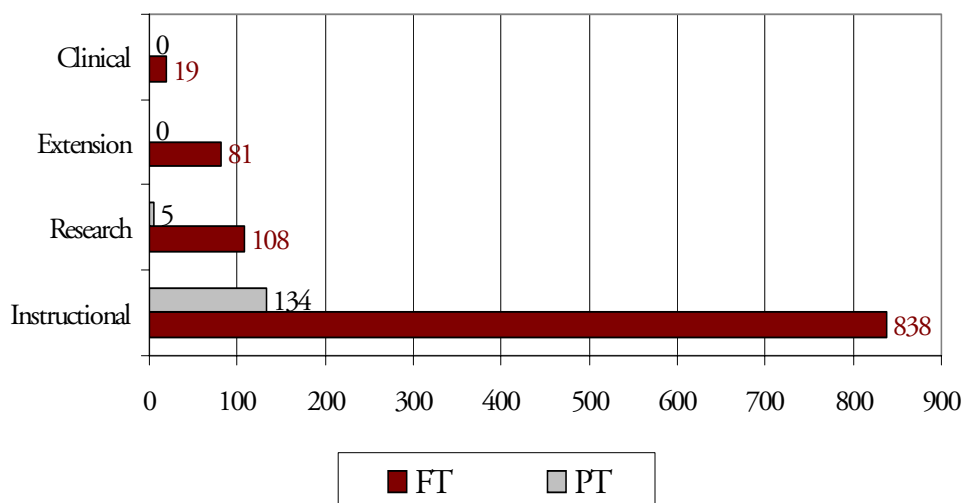

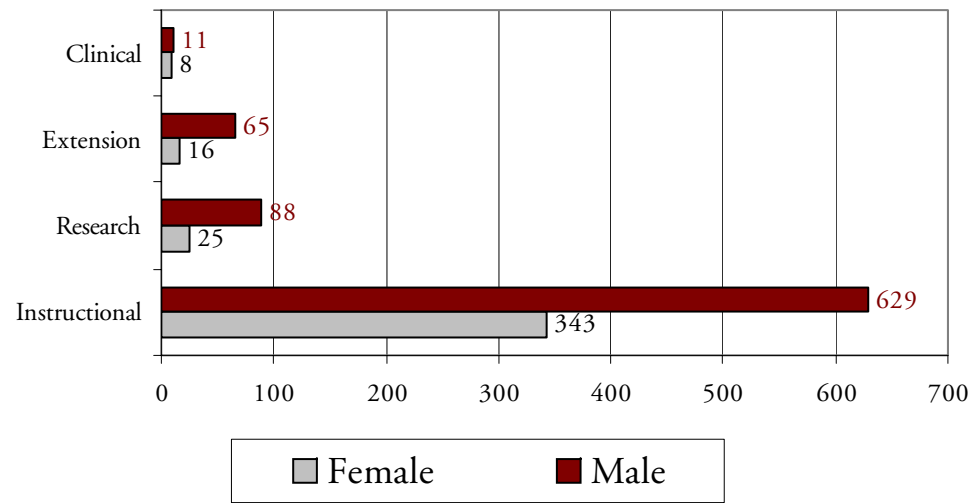

Faculty by Rank and Gender Fall 2004

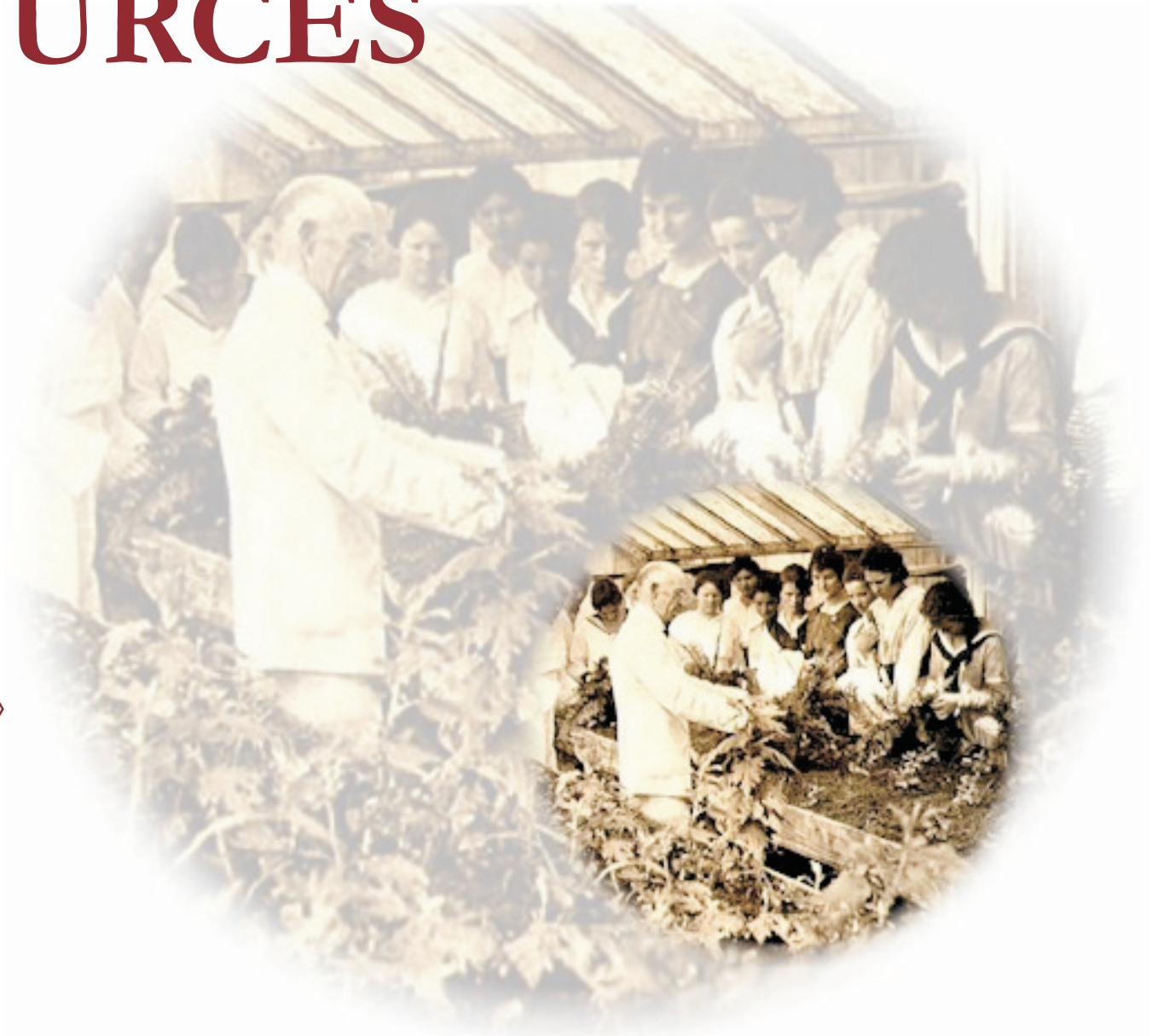

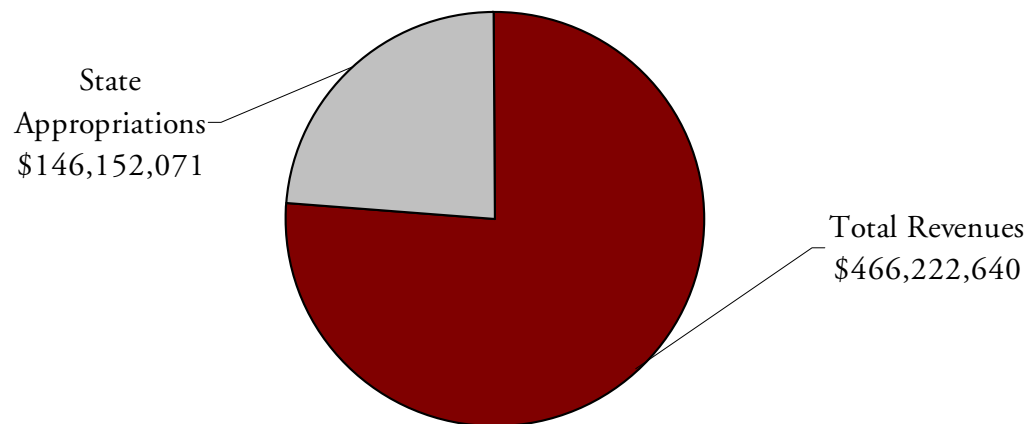

Total Revenues and State Appropriations 2003-2004





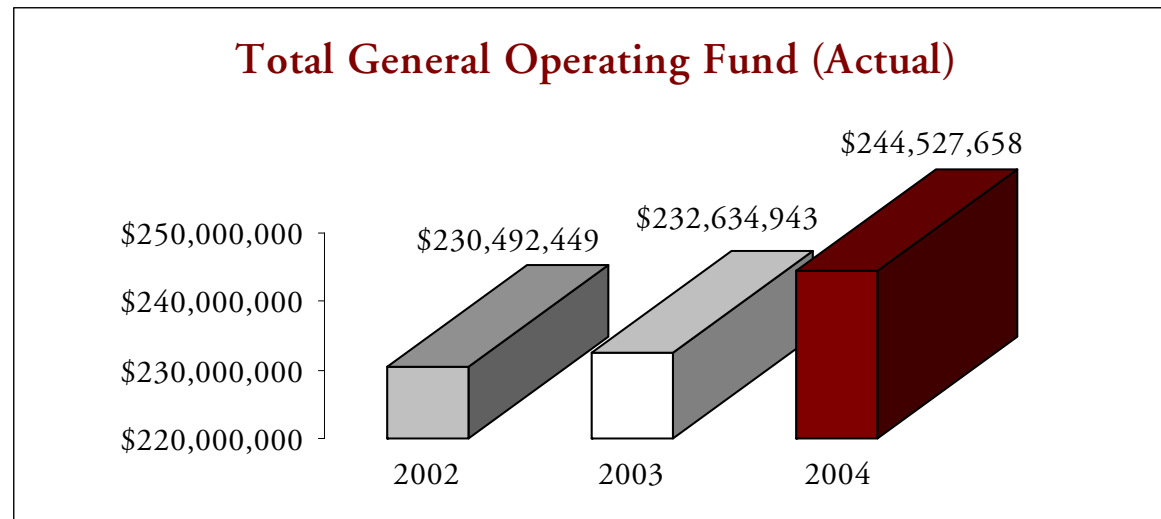

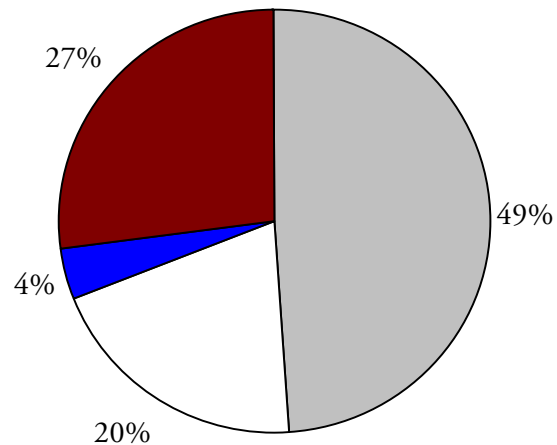

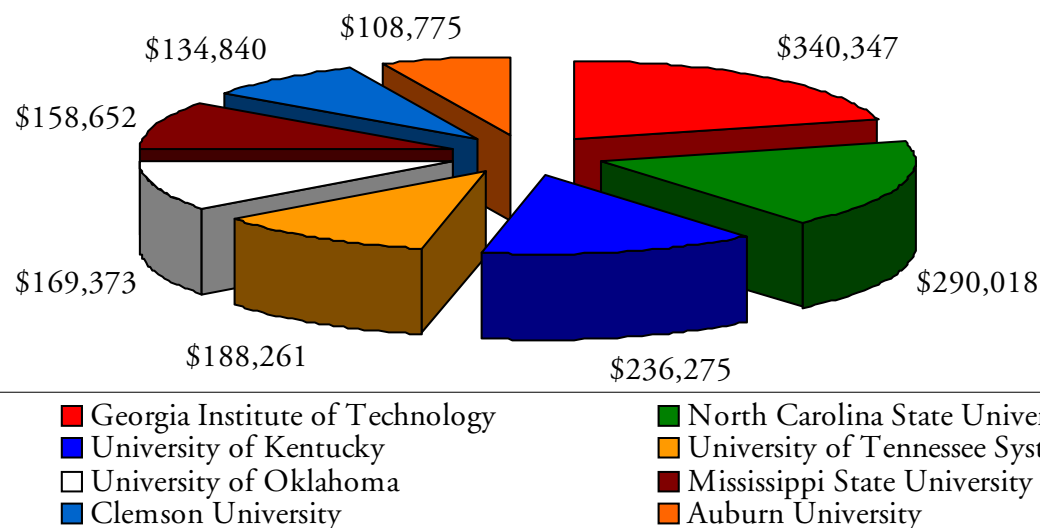
