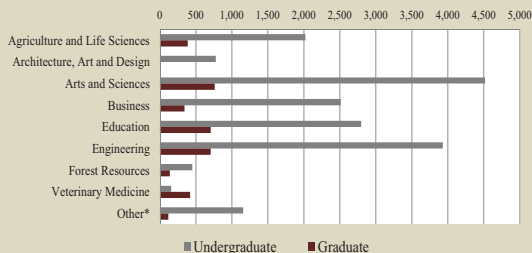

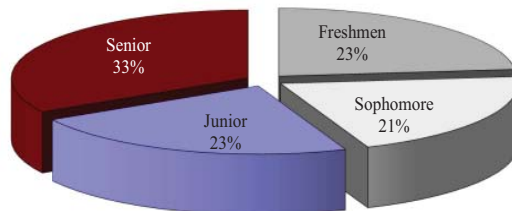

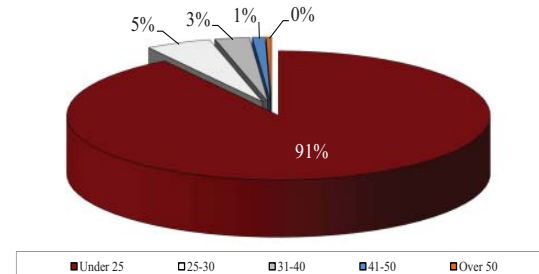
**Fall 2017 Undergraduate Class Distribution**

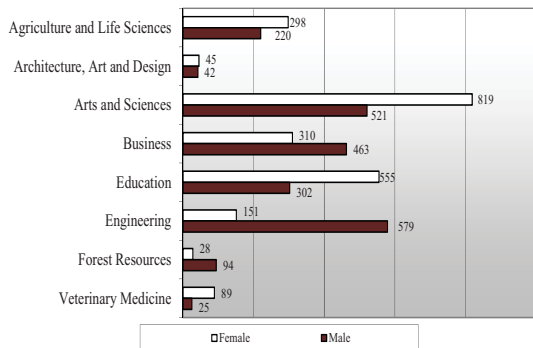
**Fall 2017 Undergraduate Age Distribution**

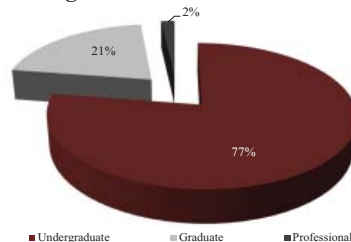

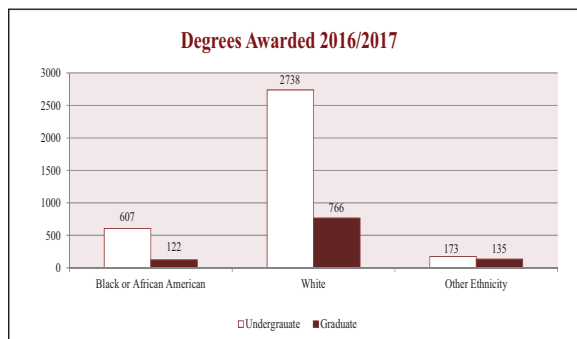

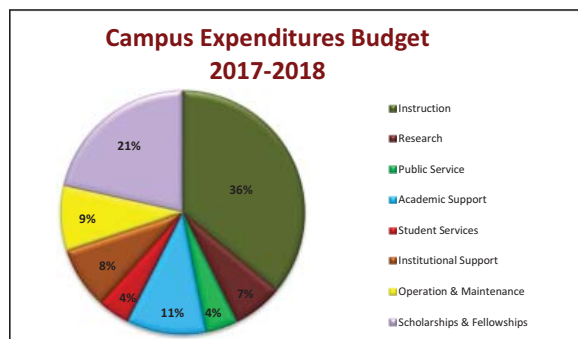
