Composite ACT Score for First-Time Freshmen

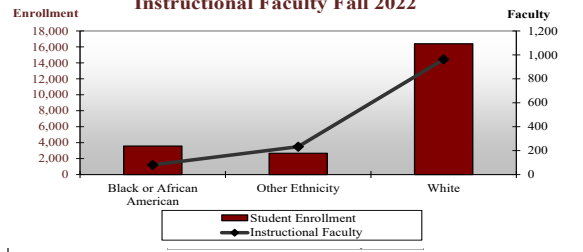

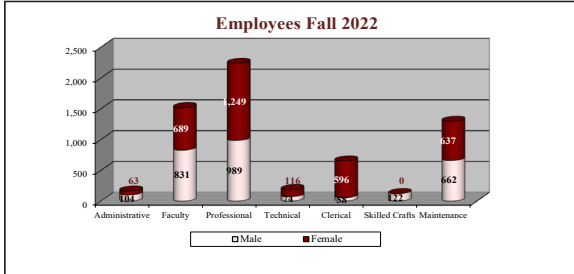

Adjacent States Enrollment Fall 2022



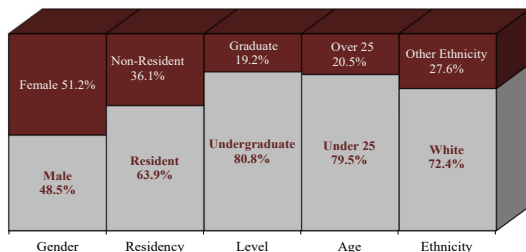

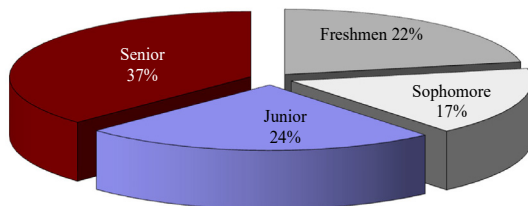

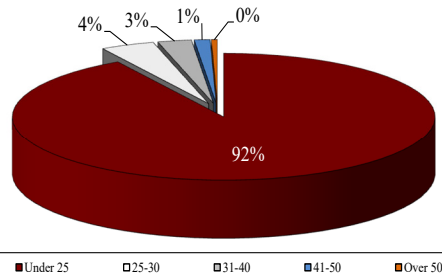
Fall 2022 Undergraduate Class Distribution



Age Distribution by Class

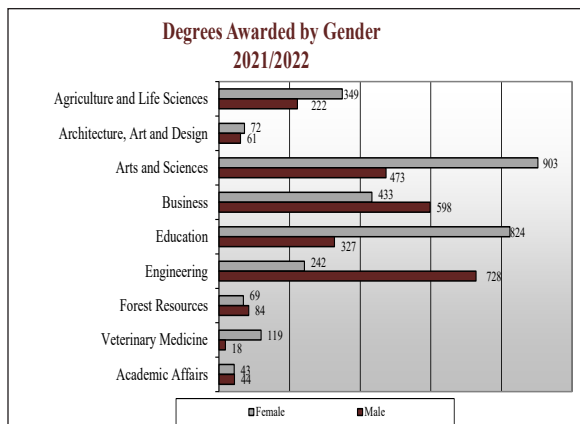

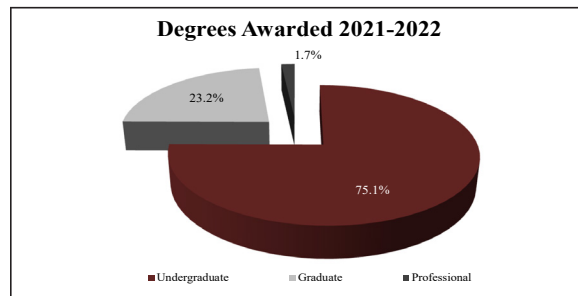

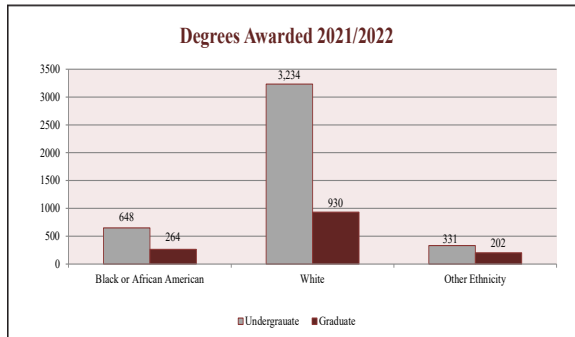

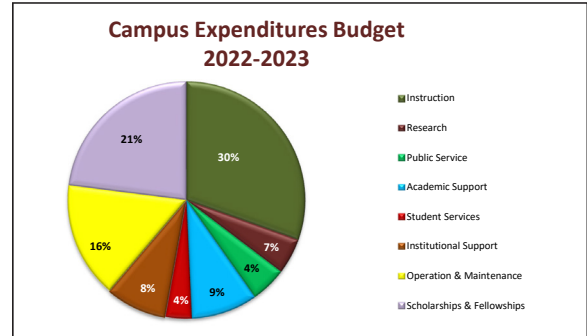
